

NJ Prevention Fellowship Program



Are you looking for an opportunity to become an agent of change in your community?

Prevention science is a field within public health that seeks to effect positive behavioral health change in our communities.



This is a Paid Fellowship.

Fellows will be paid \$20/hour up to 24 hours per week for classroom learning and strategy development activities coordinated by the New Jersey Prevention Network.

What is a Certified Prevention Specialist?

Prevention specialists work to affect positive behavioral and mental health changes in society through education, advocacy, community organizing, and project leadership, specifically dealing with substance misuse and the impact of the current addiction and overdose crises.

What is the Prevention Fellowship Program?

The Prevention Fellowship program will advance professionals toward becoming a Certified Prevention Specialist (CPS) through the Addiction Professionals Certification Board, Inc. (APCB) and gain quality experience working alongside experts in the field.

The program is targeting young, aspiring professionals who will be selected to receive education, training, and supportive services to complete all or most of their requirements to receive a CPS.

The prevention field will be expanded with a qualified, diverse cohort of young prevention professionals that will implement evidence-based strategies, interventions, and programs with a broader reach into the diverse communities in NJ.

The New Jersey Prevention Network (NJPN) is a public health agency working to create healthier communities by reducing the burden of substance misuse, addiction and other chronic disease. NJPN brings professionals together through focused networks and training opportunities supporting prevention, treatment and recovery support programs offered throughout New Jersey.

What we're looking for in an NJ Prevention Fellow

NJPN is recruiting rising college seniors with diverse backgrounds and experience to become part of the NJ Prevention Fellowship Program. A competent, LGBTQ-inclusive, ethnically, racially, and gender diverse workforce is essential in addressing the many health disparities found across the state of NJ. The Prevention Fellowship program will expand and strengthen the prevention workforce for the future.



NJPN is seeking NJ residents who:

- Reflect the diversity of New Jersey in race/ethnicity, gender identity, sexual orientation, and socio-economic status
- Have experience working or volunteering in culturally diverse communities
- Are interested in expanding their work experience in public health and want to make a difference in communities across NJ
- Have or are working towards a bachelor's or master's degree in a relevant field
- Possess effective communication skills
- Are willing to travel throughout New Jersey and work non-standard hours if needed
- Have access to transportation for in-state travel

What you can expect as an NJ Prevention Fellow

Fellows will:

- Gain and reinforce knowledge of prevention science
- Attend and complete required course work and trainings to become a Certified Prevention Specialist (CPS)
- Gain experience in strategic planning and program design, implementation, and management working with expert prevention agencies across the state (Placement opportunities available in north, central, and south NJ regions)
- Assist with public health policy and programmatic development for New Jersey
- Gain hands-on experience working within New Jersey's statewide prevention system

Support provided to fellows accepted into the NJ Prevention Fellowship program:

- NJPN will provide hourly rate stipends to fellows who agree to participate fully in the program which includes in-person trainings, courses, support sessions, experience hours, etc. (15 - 24 hours per week, as agreed upon at time of enrollment)
- Education (Phase 1)
 - Attend classes throughout 2024 to complete CPS certification course requirements
- Practicum (Phase 2)
 - Fellows will complete the requirements for their CPS certification which includes supervised practicum and experience hours.
 - Fellows will be matched to a prevention agency in NJ to work and gain required experience hours towards their CPS

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
