### **ELIGIBILITY & APPLICATION REQUIREMENTS:**

- Must submit a copy of GED, high school or higher education diploma or transcript.
- Must have a minimum of 500 hours of work/volunteer experience in within the past 2 years (signed by Supervisor).
- Must submit job/volunteer & program description (signed by Supervisor).
- Must submit signature page documenting attendance of four self-help meetings related to Substance Use or Co-Occurring Disorders and Ethical Standards Recognition Statement for CPRS (signed by Supervisor).
- Must submit Completion of pre-approved 25 Supervised Practicum Hours in a licensed or approved agency (signed by Supervisor).
- Must provide copy of certificate/transcript of 46 hours of face-to-face training focused on the Four Domains of Peer Recovery.

#### 46 Face-to-Face Training Hours Include:

- 10 training hours Advocacy
- **O 16 training hours Ethical Responsibility**
- 10 training hours Mentoring and Education
- 10 training hours Recovery Support
  - May be achieved via DMHAS required 18 hour Ethics + 30 hour CCAR.
  - NJPN training is provided at no cost to DMHAS peer workers. NJPN will provide
    official transcript for courses provided.

## **National Certified Peer Recovery Support Specialist (NCPRSS)**

via: National Certification Commission for Addiction Professionals (NCC AP)/ NAADAC

## **ELIGIBILITY & APPLICATION REQUIREMENTS:**

- Must submit copy of GED, high school or higher education diploma or transcript.
- Must have a minimum 2 years recovery from lived-experience in substance use and/or co-occurring mental health disorders (self-attested).
- Must have a minimum of 200 hours of direct practice (volunteer/paid) in a peer-recovery support environment (Supervisor-attested).
- Must submit a signed statement adhering to NAADAC NCPRSS Code of Ethics.
- Must submit two references, at least one of which must be professional.
- Must provide evidence of earning 60 contact and training hours (CEs) of peer recovery-focused education and training.
  - O At least 50% of all training hours must be face-to-face.

#### 60 Contact and Training Hours include:

- O 48 hours of peer recovery-focused education/training
  - May be achieved via DMHAS required 18 hour Ethics + 30 hour CCAR.
  - NJPN training is provided at no cost to DMHAS peer workers. NJPN will provide official transcript for courses provided.
  - Non-NJPN students, PLEASE SEE: NAADAC website (NAADAC.org) for listing of approved education providers.
- 6 hours HIV/other pathogens education
  - May be achieved via NAADAC web-series. This web-series is provided at no cost to NAADAC members: Contact NJPN for scholarship to become a NAADAC Member.
- O 6 hours of education including Recovery-Oriented Systems of Care (ROSC)
  - May be achieved via NAADAC Recovery to Practice web-series.
